The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly. (Jn. 10:10 ESV)

He is a thief and destroyer. He has turned whole populations and civilizations into dust and ash. He separates families. He tears down friendships. He opens wounds that time can't heal. He has struck fear in the hearts and minds of all through the long ages. Only fools call him their "friend" in a vain attempt at whistling in the graveyard. But he is no "friend" but the greatest of enemies, for he relentlessly hunts one and all down to lock them away in the dust of tomb and grave forever. An enemy we cannot defeat. Oh, we may snatch some briefly from his jaws, revive and resuscitate them, perform surgeries and treatments to hold him at bay for a small time. But in the end, he will have his prey. Even King David had to confess: "There is only a step between me and DEATH."

Yes, you too have felt his painful sting; for the sting of death is sin. You too have personally experienced his terrible work as he has taken your loved ones and friends from you. And if the truth be known, it isn't natural, for God never intended it to be in the beginning of all things.

That is why God sent His only-begotten Son to save us from this monster called death. Jesus is a grave robber, and you see it throughout the Gospel accounts, as He robs death of his prey. He speaks a word and takes the hand of Jairus' little girl and awakes her from the sleep of death. Yes, that's how easy it is for Jesus, like you or me waking someone who is merely asleep. He stops a funeral procession at Nain, walks up to the bier carrying a widow's son and with the words, "Young man arise," gave him back alive and well to her. Even when death had brought a man to the decay and corruption of four long days in the grave, he was no match for Jesus, for with the words, "Lazarus come out," death and its decay gave way to newness of life. Finally, when the jaws of death tried to claim Jesus as his own, he could not hold Him. For on Easter morning Jesus walked out of the tomb in victory.

The Author and Giver of Life shares that victory over death with you. He has called you out of spiritual death when He poured His Spirit into you in the waters of Baptism, raising you to newness of life. And even though we will all have to walk into the

valley of the shadow of death, we have no fear for the One who conquered death will lead our souls through to heaven's gate. And finally on the day of His return in glory, He will stand at our graves and say, "Come out" and raise our bodies from the dust of the earth to be reunited with our souls to life everlasting, destroying death forever. Even now Jesus calls you by name and raises you from the darkness of your sin to newness of life by His word. And thus is fulfilled the prophecy: "Then you, My people, will know that I Am the LORD, when I open your graves and bring you up from them. I will put My Spirit in you and you will live... Then you will know that I the LORD have spoken, and I have done it."

Church Music News:

"O come, let us sing to the Lord, let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation. Let us come into His presence with thanksgiving, let us make a joyful noise to Him with songs of praise." This excerpt from the Venite (O Come, Let Us Sing) is based on Psalm 95, and is sung in The Order of Matins.

Many of you will remember using The Order of Matins in TLH (which began on page 32). The Order of Matins is a historic morning prayer service, derived from the medieval monastic daily office, adapted during the 16th-century Reformation to emphasize Scripture and education. We are going to "resurrect" Matins beginning in March. The Order of Matins will be used the first Sunday of the month, and the service of Prayer and Preaching will still be used on the 3rd Sunday of the month. Matins in our new hymnals (LSB) has a few minor changes from TLH, but is generally the same.

LCMS Stewardship Article:

As a kid, I remember my Grandma and Grandpa Diepholz' home with extraordinary joy. Family fun. Great food. A legacy of faith. One of my lasting memories of that house was the table that sat between their twin beds. It contained a lamp, a Bible, a catechism and a hymnal. These were well-worn, as Grandpa read to Grandma every night before they went to sleep! What a treasure these tools of faith are! Let us spend some time this month in the hymnal to help us better understand our life as Christian stewards! To do this, we will use LSB 785 "We Praise You, O God."

We Praise You, O God, our Redeemer, Creator; In grateful devotion our tributes we bring. We lay it before You, and kneel and adore You; We bless Your holy name, glad praises we sing.

Stewardship is an act of worship. It flows from the grace and mercy we have received in Jesus! Faithful stewardship can never start with us. Our sinful nature will make us and our desires the center of our worship. Our tributes, our giving and our serving only flow from how the Lord Jesus has given of Himself for our sake! When we have this in clear view, our knees bow and our praises flow freely! All this flows from the Name that has been placed on us in Holy Baptism!

We worship You, God of our Fathers, we bless You; Through trial and tempest our guide You have been. When perils o'ertake us, You will not forsake us, And with Your help, O Lord, our struggles we win.

Our stewardship that flows from what God has done for us in Jesus Christ is rooted in history. Passed from one generation to the next, stewards of the Gospel connect God's provision in the past to His continued care in the present.

So often, the struggles we face are self-inflicted. While there are indeed perils that can shake us from outside of ourselves, we are more likely enduring the suffering that comes because of our own choices that are outside the Word and will of God! But even in these situations, the Lord who loves us will never forsake us. When we become selfish, self-serving and self-destructive, the Lord NEVER abandons! The Lord helps us to overcome the struggles in faith and win the victory the steward rejoices in!

With voices united our praises we offer And gladly our songs of thanksgiving we raise. With You, Lord, beside us, Your strong arm will guide us. To You, our great redeemer, forever be praise!

Stewardship is more than just an individual thing. There is a corporate nature to our steward life. We see this in the Divine Service. There, stewards of all ages, all economic strata and all languages are joined in the singular task of praise. This stewardship of

praise flows from the altar to us, out into the world and then back to the altar! God's strong arm leads us in this stewardship 24/7. This makes stewardship, in all times and places, a matter of worship. We praise our Redeemer who has entrusted us with this great stewardship of the Gospel which forgives our sins, grants us new life and salvation. And this treasure we freely share for God's glory and the benefit of our neighbor!

artwork by Pablo Picasso. They thought his Cubist portraits were funny! The kindergarten artists made their own version of Picasso's "Flowers in the Hand".

In first grade we talked about flamenco dancers and how they used fans when they danced. After looked at various examples, the first grade artists painted their own folded fans. Second grade also looked at artwork by Pablo Picasso. They thought the Cubist style was interesting and looked at how he would take a realistic picture and break it down into his style. Inspired by his bull artwork, the second grade artists made their own versions in the Cubist style using oil pastels.

The third and fourth grade class learned about some interesting facts about Spain: has many festivals, such as the 'Tomatina' and the 'Running of the Bulls', it is the largest producer of olive oil, it has the world's oldest restaurant that has been serving food since 1725, it has the world's oldest light house still in use that was built by the Romans, it is the birthplace of famous artists like Pablo Picasso and Salvador Dali. They created hand "painted" tiles using Spanish designs as inspiration.

The fifth and sixth grade class also looked at artwork by Pablo Picasso. They creates their own version of a Cubist style bull, but completed theirs using acrylic paint. The seventh and grade class was really challenged by their art project. They look at Salvado Dali's "The Elephants painting. He created surreal elephants with exaggerated legs. The seventh and eighth grade artist attached wood skewers to the legs of elephant figurines. They then wrapped plaster wraps around the legs and finished by painting their elephants. Our first experience using clay was a bit of a disaster!

Treasurer report was presented and filed for audit.

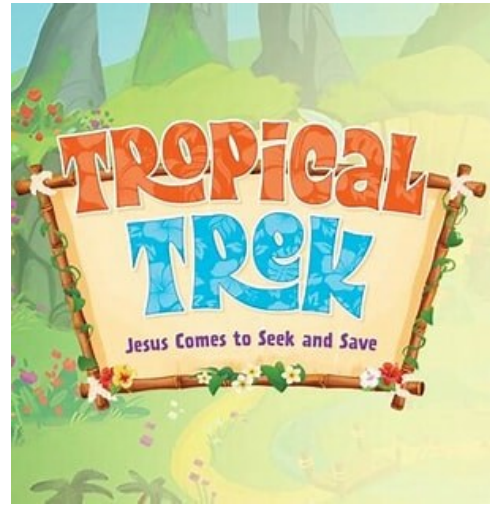
Reports and Business:
